Objections will be dealt with according to procedures described in the 2012 Oil and Gas Act and DEP regulations. By signing this form, the coal operator or owner attests that this notice has been mailed by certified mail to the well operator / owner listed above, and that the coal operator will remove no coal nor cut any passageway within 150 feet of this well or permitted location until DEP issues the pillar permit. Instructions for Submitting an Application for a Coal Pillar Permit and Well Pillar Plan

The following instructions are designed to assist the applicant in properly completing the *Application for a Coal Pillar Permit*, form 8000-PM-OOGM0007 and Well Pillar Plan, form 8000-PM-OOGM0007A. Please type or print clearly when completing the form. Pursuant to Section 3224 of the 2012 Oil and Gas Act (58 Pa. C.S. Sections 3201-3274), a coal operator intending to mine within 500 feet of an oil or gas well to notify the well operator or owner and the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) of such proximity of mining to the well and propose a plan to leave a coal pillar or block to protect the well. Use the *Application For A Coal Pillar Permit* form for the notice and attach the *Well Pillar Plan*, for the proposed pillar plan.

Coal Operator or Owner

An underground coal mine operator or owner must notify the well operator / owner when the mine operator has mined within 500 feet of any oil or gas well, or a permitted well location not yet drilled. Also at this time, the coal operator must submit to the DEP a plat showing the mine workings and proposed mine plan to leave a coal pillar or block to protect the well. The coal operator may not mine within 150 feet of the well location without having a pillar permit issued by the DEP. By signing this form, the coal operator or owner attests that this notice has been mailed to the well operator / owner, and that the coal operator will remove no coal nor cut any passage way within 150 feet of this well or permitted location until the DEP approves a coal pillar plan.

Fill in the information about the coal operator and mine, well operator and well, and location information. If the well is older and may not be documented in DEP files, please provide whatever information you can about drilling, completion, and production history. Also, on the plan form, be sure to fill in the correct mine name and section, coal seam name, elevations at the well of the land surface and bottom of the coal seam, and the name and registration of the engineer who prepared the plan.

The applicant (coal operator) is reminded that it is a misdemeanor to make a false statement on this application. (18 Pa. C.S. Section 4094)

Well Operator or Owner

The well operator has 10 days from receipt of this notice to file an objection with DEP about the coal operator's proposed pillar plan to protect the well. DEP will deal with objections according to procedures described in the 2012 Oil and Gas Act and DEP regulations. Reply to the DEP office (in Pittsburgh or Meadville) indicated in the notice.

Checklist and Additional Information

A *Well Pillar Plan* is always required. Make sure that the well operator's name and address is current and matches the information on the Application for a Coal Pillar Permit. Note the most recent operator's name and address in the appropriate fields on the plan form. If the well is abandoned and the operator unknown, fill in "Unknown" in the space for the well operator's name. Please submit copies of any well records and completion reports that you have for this well.

Submit application to the appropriate district oil and gas office.
